

 - - Marwa Aly: Let's first discuss the GPSA History.
 - 1971: Board of Regents approved that the Graduate Student Association be recognized as a separate entity from ASWSU
 - 1971: GSA proposed a decreased Athletic Fee for grad students due to time constraints and low participation
 - Mid 1980s: GPSA developed TA training workshop
 - 1986: NAGPS (national association of graduate-professional students) was established on the WSU Pullman campus
 - 1988: Established the Student Health Advisory Council to be more involved in health insurance decision
 - o 1989: First grad student Research Expo
 - 1990: GPSA Day observed at WSU
 - 1994: Graduate student health insurance coverage by WSU as introduced by GPSA
 - o 1996: GPSA Study Center in Library
 - o 1997: Affiliate funding provided to g-p RSOs
 - 1999: President urged the importance of having GPSA Representation at all WSU campus including Tri-Cities, Spokane, and Vancouver



- 1999: Held first GPSA/OGRD (Office of Grant and Research Development) Grant Writing Workshop

- GPSA strives to support WSU's graduate and professional students academically, financially, and experientially.

- Improve transparency and institutional memory to lay the foundation for future GPSA boards and work.
- To advocate not only for professional life but also personal lives of graduate and professional students.
- To work towards more engagement with senators and graduate and professional students broadly, with the goal of strengthening an atmosphere of shared trust and safety between students and student-leaders.

• Marwa Aly: Everyone of you are leaders. So, GPSA leaders are not The officers only are not the chairs of the committees only, but every senator in GPSA is a leader. The structure of the GPSA we have Matt Shaw, he is our associate director, Mat. Say, Hi! So! As I mentioned before, the senators are the core for GPSA, You come from your departments, you represent your departments. So you bring the issues to GPSA, and the Executive Board with their chairs. They help you to raise these issues. They help you to connect with the Admins. They help you to resolve their concerns. Okay, so GPSA structure is a senators and each Senator should serve in GPSA committee. So we have committee chairs, and in a minute I will ask each committee chair to give a brief description about their committee's duties and then we have the executive officers, the VPLA, the resident of GPSA, and the VP, and plus all of this we are working with the graduate school, Dr. Tammy Berry, and she helps us a lot. And the student involvement to process our payments and financial services.

Ajay Barman: Hello, everyone. My name is Ajay Barman, and I'm the president of Graduate and Professional Student Association and welcome to the academic year 2024 and 25. And as Marwa was mentioning, you are the Senator, and you are on the top of our structure because you are the representative from your department and GPSA for the GPSA we advocate for the students like for their socially, academically, professionally. But you are the people who bring the issues to us and we need to know what issues to work for. If, as a President executive board, if they get the chance to meet with our admin, but if they don't know what is going on in the university, they cannot advocate for us. I cannot advocate, and at the end the GPSA will ultimately fail. So it's up to you the department you are representing. Talk with your department peer. If there is an issue. This is the interdisciplinary communication platform that we created, that to know what is going on in the university, what is going on in your department. So that's why you were on the top and you are representing all the graduate and professional students. So the more information we will bring in our GPSA, the more actively, we will be able to work. So that's why it's the teamwork. GPSA cannot run by one person. It's a team effort. So that's why more, we will work as a team we will be. We will be achieving like greater things in our upcoming

It's really important for the person who is willing to do the job, and you are that person who chosen from your department to represent them.

- Marwa Aly: So I am here to talk about the Budget Committee. So in the Budget Committee we are track the tracking the budget for the RSOs, the registered organizations that received fund affiliating funding from GPSA. We have 2 rounds of the fall and the spring to fund them. We open the applications. We review the applications. We also receive requests like special requests from them. We handle the budget, we overseas a budget for the year for all the committees. We also plan for the budget for next year. So in February we should plan. We should prepare our presentation and present to the SNA Committee. What is the request for us for next year? How much do we need for the next year in order to fund the GPSA for the next year. So that's a briefly about budget committee. If you like numbers, if you like to track the budget. If you like to oversee the budget, please consider to join the Budget Committee.
- Tathagata Pal: So I am Tathagata PAL, and I go by, PAL, and I'm the VP of legislative affairs for GPSA, and I'm also the chair of the Legislative Affairs Committee. 1st of all, I'm so sorry for not being able to be with you guys in person. I apologize. I apologize for that and welcome to GPSA. So what my committee does is we do a lot of advocacy work, not just at the university level. But, starting from the university level, we work at the city level, at the state level, and even at the Federal level, to advocate for graduate and professional students in WSU, Pullman. Go to like, join us for the cook day and talk with legislators, talk with the Congressmen. Then please do sign up for the Legislative Affairs Committee. So I believe we all will be given like a form, some kind of form where you'll be asked to like enter your choice like first, second, and 3rd choices for the GPSA committees. Please. Consider joining Affairs Committee. We like you might have to do a little bit of travel, but if you like traveling, if you like, advocating for other for your peers and your colleagues.  the application process is way simpler this time around. So 2 years ago we





- Madison Honig: I'm the chair of community affairs. So my committee is really focused on being the liaison between the graduate and professional student community and the larger community that we're in Pullman and Moscow. And so we organize a lot of events and do a lot of advocacy work. So some of the events we do is a large food can drive that requires a lot of volunteering and organizing. We do things like a park cleanup. We've done an invasive weeding party. And yeah, so we do a lot of event planning. But we're also focused on finding solutions for some key advocacy points. So we work on things like community safety, sustainability, food security and transportation. So if you're interested in any of those things, you might be a good fit for community affairs. We also have the Food Security Committee that is specifically addressing issues of food security in the graduate student community. There'll be more information about that and subsequent meetings. 

If you have questions about travel grants, and then GPS also gives, like excellence awards in various categories to celebrate the work that all the graduate and professional students do. And these happens in spring. So you will get an email about like nominating yourself or a colleague. You can also nominate your professors for excellent awards. So that's something that GPSA does, and also we offer dissertation grants. So you have heard from Marwa that you will receive like \$500 per person each semester, as dissertation grants. Usually, I think, the priority is given to the people who have passed their prelims and then and also GPSA provides funding to the registered organizations. Who are RSOs. So if you are part of any RSO. Or if you, your department has. RSOs. Please let them know that we provide funding so that they reach out to us, and there will be soon a call for funding applications. So please keep an eye out for that and you have heard from red one that GPSA does a lot of fun stuff like ice cream social, and this morning we had like coffee. Hour, which was great like people came, had coffee pastries, and we talked so much. So it's a great opportunity to kind of make new friends networking, and, you know, unwind a little bit. It is. You know I was crazy. Crazy. Schedule and then also, you will receive, like emails about, like all the monthly GPSA programming activities. And then we also do like a lot of social activities and welcome back hike is happening and you can kind of contact with one if you are interested, especially if you need a ride to go to that hike. 



Executive board duties

Nazua Idris: So we will talk more about the Senate meetings like during the 1st Senate meeting. I'll just quickly go over some of the important parts. So as Marwa already explained, all the duties of Senator. I would just like to emphasize that. What are the expectations from the senators? So the 1st expectation is definitely be enthusiastic about what you are doing like being here on time staying the entire time, and then, you know you will see that whenever we are having meeting and we are voting on some issues, then you kind of have to discuss and share your opinions about those issues. So we'll talk about the rule rules about that, and also be enthusiastic about the committee work that you will do because you will be joining different committees, and you will be doing a lot of work there. So just be enthusiastic about whatever you do, and trust me like. If you are more proactive, more enthusiastic. You will feel more connected to the community, and it will also, like help you build your professional and you know, personal and academic skills and also be kind to each other and also to yourself. because we are all graduate and professional students having our own life and tons of issues. And you know lots of duties. So it's okay to let us know if you are unable to, you know, attend a meeting. As Marwa also said, that there will be case by case basis, where you may have to attend digitally. but the best way is to, as I mentioned, like, be kind to yourself and to others just like respond to the emails in a timely manner, and always be in contact with Marwa. She's the chair for the Senate Committee, and also be in contact with the committees like the chair of the committees you are working with. That makes things easier for you and also for them. And please let them know like, if we're unable to join a meeting or carry out a task ahead of time, so they can make you know. arrangements for that. And it's okay to make mistakes. Every one of us makes mistakes. So please, as Marwa said, because I kept telling her that I'm sorry for asking you stupid questions because I joined, just joined the IAC and I have tons of questions for her all the time, and I'm really ashamed of that. But Ajay and Marwa, both of them have been very helpful because I have been asking tons of questions, and they're they have been very patient with me. So that's the culture we want to cultivate here like being patient and being kind to each other, listen to each other, which is very important, and also listening to each other, means listening to the people in your department, too, because you have already seen that. All of you are required to like all of you are, you know, connecting GPSA with your individual departments, so it will be great like if we all can, you know. So, we are family within GPSA and outside of GPSA as WSU as a family. So, I think, like keeping that in mind, like helping another family member is really, really, really important. So, like all these things like being enthusiastic and proactive and being kind to each other and ourselves. Hopefully, we will be able to achieve the goals that we will set. We have set for this year, so again, like, we're talking about this again and again, the purpose of these meetings will be to, you know, conduct business and making decisions about the issues that concern our lives. As graduate and professional students. And as you have seen that GPSA has programs that also concerns your family's life, too. For example, like the childcare policy that is affecting your family to food pantry that is affecting your family, too. So, you know, like you can see, like, how much important the work is, and like your passion, dedication and motivation, can make things way better. Right? and I. We have been talking about this, and I would again like shout out to Madison like she was so passionate about like the food pantry and food security issue that the referendum got passed. So, this is something like we have to learn from each other. That being passionate makes the change. So, we all hope that you are here because you're passionate about like your colleagues and your own lives, too, and it matters so much like as a senator. You can make so many differences. So, I cannot emphasize this more. And also, again, like discuss debate. Engage. I'm not going through all this slide because we will talk about that next semester. So, this is what happens when you come to a meeting like there will be issues. You have to vote on them. You have to discuss those or engage with those issues. And it's funny because we had, like a speaker yesterday at our Executive Board training, and we were asking them like, what is the difference between discuss and debate? And he said, there is no difference, basically. So, these are alternative words. And also, as I've already mentioned that being respectful and being kind to each other is very important. So, like, however, you feel about an issue, raise your voice, but also, like be polite, professional, respectful to each other, patient and positive. And I really liked what Marwa said about like her kids like being in a car and being in Pullman. So, things can be different things from different perspectives. But if we carefully, patiently listen to each other, that will make all the difference, so we hope that we will see that here and again, like you will vote on things, and then you will make resolutions. You will make you know, institute new policies like we will make them all together or revise things, and you will see those in the upcoming meetings. And also, one of the purposes of for being here is also to learn. So GPSA is not about like only voting and being here, but also about your own professional and academic





development, and there will be a lot of speakers here. Who will be here. We'll be talking about the university policies and stuff like that, and trust me, I got a lot of ideas. - Mock Vote on "Is Pineapple a pizza topping?" to understand the flow of Robert's Rules & Voting.
- Ajay Barman: I want to make a motion that GPSA should formally accept pineapple is a pizza topping.
- Andrew Sutherland: I, Andrew Sutherland, enthusiastically. Second.
- Marwa Aly: I will move to debate.
- Madison Honig: I am from the Anthropology Department, but I'm also the
 chair of community affairs. So I urge the Senate to consider that although the
 pineapple is an unusual topping. It is a fruit. You know what else is a fruit? A
 tomato and tomatoes are regularly on pizza and as a Canadian I can vote that
 this is a pizza topping, because Canada was the place that they invented this.
 So I'm convincing the Senate that we should vote. Yes.
- Desmond Aboagye: So there's a difference between tomato and pineapple. Pineapple is usually eaten straightforward, raw. When you are making pizza you have to cook it cooking the pineapple straight away. It breaks down all the important vitals, vitamins and nutrients that you're going to get from the pineapple, anyway, and so adding pineapple as the top into pizza is a no, no, a complete, no, no, and I don't think we should accept this at all.


